Inferences: it seems to be that they are resting after a long day, though they will most likely move soon due to rising tide. They seem to have socially coordinated them selves by rank or size, seeing as the bigger ones are in towards the middle and the smaller out wards to the edge. They are most likely a year round residential group.

Animals: Steller sea lions

in group: 20+ Tide: going out

Observations: They are at a popular haul out with some on the rock and others in the water. There seems to be a territorial battle taking place. The Steller sea lion haul out and the Harbor seal haul out are rather close i'd say that they seem a couple 100 yards from each other maybe half a mile.

Inferences: I'm going to assume that this group is mostly made up of males. They all seem to be fully grown if not younger. They are probably a group just staying for the season.
